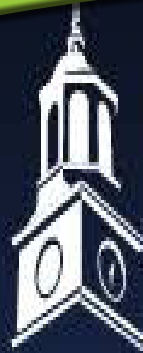

A Better You!

For our new church year the ACTIVE Christian Living emphasis will be "A Better You!"

What can each of us do to enrich our lives and improve our quality of life? One way is life-long learning. Because you think that you passed some magical age that you consider the end of learning, now is the time to change that negative idea. Life-long learning is essential for your brain, health and well-being.



In 2001, the National Endowment for the Arts developed an agreement with The George Washington University to conduct a multi-site national study with the aim of measuring the impact of professional community-based cultural programs on the general health, mental health, and social activities of older persons. Results reveal strikingly positive differences in the active group (those involved in intensive art programs) as compared to a control group not involved in intensive cultural programs. Those involved in the weekly participatory art programs, after two years reported:

- Better health, fewer doctor visits, and less medication usage;
- More positive responses on mental

- health measures;
- More involvement in overall activities.

In conclusion, these results point to powerful positive intervention effects of these community-based art programs run by professional artists. They point to true health promotion and disease prevention effects. They reveal a positive impact on maintaining independence and on reducing dependency. This latter point demonstrates that these community-based cultural programs for older adults appear to be reducing risk factors that drive the need for long-term care.

Yellow Dot Program

The "Yellow Dot" program provides detailed medical information following an automobile crash. Participants of the program receive a "Yellow Dot" decal, a "Yellow Dot" folder and an information form. Placing a "Yellow Dot" decal on the driver's side rear window of a vehicle alerts first responders to check the glove compartment for the "Yellow Dot" folder containing pertinent contact and health information regarding the driver.

Vial of Life

The Vial of Life is a program that allows individuals to have their complete medical information ready in their home for emergency personnel to reference during an emergency when a person is unable to speak or remember this information. The kit includes decals, medical information forms, and other materials.

The "Yellow Dot" and "Vial of Life" programs are free services provided to individuals.

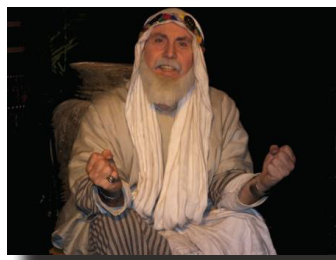

Andy Hodges had been excluded from military service due to a lingering shoulder injury from his college-football days. Devastated but determined, Andy refused to sit at home while his fellow Americans risked their lives, so he joined the Red Cross. In the fall of 1944, Andy was tapped for what sounded like a suicide mission: a desperate

attempt to aid the Allied POWs in occupied France—alone and unarmed, matching his wits against the Nazi war machine.

Denise George co-authored the book with Andrew Gerow Hodges, Jr. about his father's story about saving WWII POW's.
