The Aliceville Museum started in the 1980s as an exhibit in a single room at the Aliceville Public Library. In 1993, with the donation of the former Aliceville

Coca-Cola Bottling Plant buildings and property to the Museum by the Coca-Cola Bottling Plant of Meridian Mississippi, the Museum began to grow tremendously. Today, the Museum boasts four extensive exhibits filling three large buildings and a courtyard in downtown Aliceville.

The main exhibit features artifacts from the Aliceville Prisoner of War Camp that existed from 1942 to 1945. This exhibit includes the largest collection of WWII POW artifacts in the US. In addition to an extensive collection of POW artwork, there is furniture and other everyday items, and hundreds of documents, drawings, and photographs detailing daily life at the camp. Hear from former POW's and camp personnel through video-taped interviews.

After touring the museum we will head off to Carrollton, AL to eat lunch at the Town Square Diner. The place has lots of great reviews. Finding good hole-in-the-wall places is part of the fun of our tour experiences. Book your slot today through Realm or call the church office. **Reservations are due by Wednesday, August 3.**

While planning day-trips, I stumbled across the little town of Mooresville, AL located in North AL near Huntsville. Mooresville is one of the oldest incorporated towns in Alabama, having been incorporated on November 16, 1818, when Alabama was still a Territory. It was named for early settlers, Robert and William Moore who located on land which became the site of Mooresville. Andrew Johnson, later to become the 17th president of the United States, lived in Mooresville as an apprentice tailor when he was a young man. The Union Army occupied Mooresville several times during the Civil War, and a few skirmishes were fought in the vicinity. Future U.S. president James Garfield, then a Union general camped in the area, delivered a sermon at the Mooresville Church of Christ in 1863.

The entire town, often described as Alabama's "Williamsburg," is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Many of the older public buildings, including the Stagecoach Inn and Tavern, the Brick Church, the Post Office, and the Church of Christ, are owned and maintained by the town's residents

We will enjoy a guided tour where we'll hear stories and important information about the town. After the tour, we'll stop by Lyla's Little House to enjoy some southern hospitality and to purchase some pralines, cheese straws, and other sweets. After "shooting the breeze" at Lyla's we'll go up the road a little ways to eat at the Old Greenbrier BBQ Restaurant. Don't miss this trip. Reserve your spot today! Don't delay...
